

## **U. S. SOLDIER KILLED 20 NAZIS AT DIEPPE**

*He Will Soon Be Honored for  
Feat, Says Writer, Here*

A young Midwestern Army corporal who participated in the Commando raid on Dieppe is to be honored soon by Lord Louis Mountbatten, Chief of Combined Operations, it was said last night by Quentin Reynolds, magazine writer, when he and eight other passengers arrived at La Guardia Field on an American Export Airlines Flying Ace.

Mr. Reynolds said he was not at liberty to reveal the soldier's name, but said the citation was for having killed twenty German soldiers while acting as a sniper. Mr. Reynolds watched the raid from the deck of a destroyer, shelled for the nine hours the ship lay in the harbor.

Another passenger was Neil S. Beaton, president of the British Cooperatives Congress, who is to address the convention of the American Cooperatives League in Minneapolis on Sept. 28. He also said he hoped to discuss rationing with OPA officials here.

Also on board the Flying Ace, commanded by Captain Cameron T. Robinson, was Archibald A. Gordon, en route to the British Embassy at Washington to assume the post of labor attaché. He will serve principally as a liaison officer on industrial and manpower problems.
